CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Showmanship –

Showmanship is a type of best handler class, where the handler is judged on his/her way of presenting their horse. A short pattern is set for competitors to complete and then the class is judged in the line up. The class is judged solely on the performance of the handler.

Horsemanship –

The class consists of a short pattern follow by the rail work where riders are judged at the walk, jog and lope. The pattern will consist of several elements that will enable the judge to see which rider and guide their horse with the best manner and style.

Pleasure –

This class is judged on the rail, horses are judged at the walk, jog and lope on both reins and must also perform a rein back. The idea is to demonstrate the most comfortable mannerly horse that could be used to cover great distances.

Trail –

Trail originates from the time when riding from one place to another could mean crossing large distances over sometimes difficult terrain. Trail is judged on the performance of the horse over obstacles, with the emphasis on manners, response to rider and quality of movement.

Reining –

Reining consists of the riders performing a pattern that contains circles, large and fast and small and slow, flying changes, sliding stops, roll backs and spins.

Barrel Racing –

Barrel racing consists of competitors racing around a course of three barrels placed in a triangular pattern. Riders are penalised if they knock over a barrel.

Novice Classes –

These classes are open to youth riders and non professionals. Youth riders will be placed separately. These classes can be ridden two handed in either a snaffle or a curb, or one handed in a curb. Note. Judge will award extra points to horses ridden one handed in a curb. Two handed in a snaffle is correct and will be judged as normal.

Walk Jog Classes –

These classes are open to riders who have not won prize money in excess of £25 in a lifetime and can be ridden two handed in either a snaffle or a curb. Note. Judge will award extra points to horses ridden one handed in a curb. Two handed in a snaffle is correct and will be judged as normal. No professionals

Youth Classes –

These classes are open to riders aged 18 or under.

Buckaroos -

These classes are for riders aged 6 years and under

Open Classes / In Hand

These classes are open to all.
